Over seventy swimmers took part in this year's Club Championships at Quayside, held over five days in November. It was great to see some of our younger swimmers making so much progress, while many seats in the gallery were taken up with plenty of loud support.

The KKSC mathematicians have been crunching the numbers from each event to figure out the overall winner in every age group. The more events a swimmer took part in, the more points they could win. It led to younger swimmers competing in many challenging events!

Cody Steer, who only recently entered silver squad, swam really well in both the 200 butterfly and 400 freestyle. Lottie Taylor, aged 9, swam several long distance events for the first time and raced in every single session.

Plymouth Xmas Splash: Preview

We have fifteen swimmers competing in 89 races at the upcoming Xmas Splash at the Plymouth Life Centre.

With all fifteen swimmers taking part on the final Sunday, it'll be the biggest team Kingfishers have sent to a competition since before Covid.

With eleven swimmers currently qualified for the County Championships in January, there will be hopes that more can be added to the list. Fabiano Noto is only five seconds off the qualifying time in 200 breaststroke, while the fast improving Ollie McKinlay believes he can go faster in the 200 freestyle.

Meanwhile, Lucas Quiggin will swim his first 400 IM.

James Richards and Alysia Stringer returned to the pool after long absences, while Dan Quiggin took part in some of his first ever races.

2: Parent volunteers help keep the champs smooth

The tireless of work of our timekeepers and marshals meant that swimmers were always prepared for their races. So many of you offered to help out, something we're incredibly grateful for. A massive shout out to young volunteer Thea Cole, who when not swimming (and causing false starts) was brilliant with some of our youngest swimmers on poolside.

Skins racing was invented in Australia, in an attempt to make swimming more exciting. Each competitor keeps swimming 50 Freestyles, with the slowest being eliminated until only two remain to race for the cash prize.

For the boys, Aaron Lansdale was denied for a second year running by Will Rawlinson. In the girls, Chloe Morris became the youngest Skins winner in club history in a photo finish over Jess Stewart - an amazing achievement.

Regional Qualifying Times for 2024

Below you will find the qualifying times that your child needs to achieve at a **Level 3 meet**, such as the Two Counties Meet. The Q-times are for long-course pools (50m lengths rather than 25).

Regional qualifying times are incredibly difficult to achieve. In twenty-five years of Kingfishers, only about fifty swimmers have achieved at least one time. To qualify, your child very likely would need to be training at least three times per week.

Remember to read the column that is your age on the 31st December 2024.

Blast from the Past: Holly Gunner

One of our best ever swimmers tells us about her Kingfisher memories

On the previous page, you'll find a list of regional qualifying times. While only about fifty of our swimmers have ever qualified for regionals, the list of those achieving **national standard times** is far fewer.

Only seven Kingfishers have managed it, including just three females. Emily Lawrence and Becky Noyce have qualified, but the first female to do so was Holly Gunner. We asked Holly to respond to three questions to share her wisdom with our younger swimmers.



Q: What are your favourite memories of swimming with the club?



"I have so many happy memories from my time at KKSC - the team was a second family whilst I was growing up. My highlights include the many trips around the country competing in the Arena League (always cheering for each other during every race!), winning the Skins Event to the terrifying Jaws soundtrack and captaining the club for many years."

Q: What were your best achievements?



My proudest moment was competing at the National Championships twice - in 50m Freestyle and 50m Butterfly. With the Freestyle, I travelled (with only my Mum) to Millfield on a snowy December weekend and had one shot to qualify and I did it! I loved racing at Ponds Forge in Sheffield – both events were a real splash and dash! These achievements now feel full circle for me, as I went on to work at Millfield as a swimming coach and Year 5 teacher! I am also so proud to have broken the one-minute barrier for 100m Freestyle - it was the result of a lot of hard work!

Q: How has being a swimmer helped you in your life?

Swimming taught me to work hard, be patient and to deal with disappointment. I met so many fantastic people who are now lifelong friends whilst at KKSC and although getting up early was really tough for me, I am so grateful to have had swimming to give me a focus, commitment and passion!

Swimming also helped me to secure a coaching job at Millfield, through the skills and knowledge I picked up whilst being coached by Sharon and Karen for many years.

If you are swimming in Stage 6 or above, it may be possible to pass our club trials.

A Stage 6 swimmer may have more potential to be a competitive swimmer than a Stage 9 swimmer. Even though several of our coaches work in Quayside's swim school, your child's swim stage will not be taken into consideration when we watch them swim for the first time.

Our youngest club member is currently 7 years old.

Head Coach Karen determined to give it a go

In light of our growth in 2023, the club has decided to enter this year's Devon Interclub Gala on **Saturday 13th January**.

Kingfishers have a great history in the event.

At one point, the club was only behind Plymouth Leander, Exeter City, Kelly College and Barnstaple in the pecking order. We even had the edge over our South Hams rivals Dinnaton!

However 2024 will all be about the experience. We hope those that get selected to represent the club have great fun competing against swimmers of a similar age from other teams.

How many points can we score? Please come along and support the team in taking a brave step back towards competing in the sport's biggest events.

How does the Interclub Gala work?

The event will feature one individual swim in each stroke for boys and girls in every age group.

The age groups are: 11 & Under, 13 & Under, 15 & Under, Open

We believe that 11 & Under swimmers will compete in 50m races, while everybody else will compete in 100m races. A swimmer is normally allowed to compete in a maximum of 2 individual races for the team in their age group.

Later in the afternoon, there will also be relays. In each age group, 2 boys and 2 girls will join forces in a $4 \times 50m$ freestyle relay and a $4 \times 50m$ medley relay. There will also be a Freestyle Cannon Relay, which is made up of swimmers of different age groups.

The event is **short-course**. In addition, anyone who has met the Devon County Qualifying Time for the 100m Individual Medley is invited to compete in that event on the same day.


For a small yearly fee of less than £10, you can follow the results from many of the events that Kingfishers take part in **as it happens!**



However my writing isn't the reason I'll be seen less on poolside in January, February and March.





All stories are set along the South West coast.


